Our Impact

Friedreich's Ataxia is a rare, inherited, degenerative disease. It damages the spinal cord, peripheral nerves, and the cerebellum portion of the brain. Unsteady, awkward movements and a loss of sensation due to nerve injury develop as the disease progresses.



"What brought me to the YMCA is the family atmosphere. I never had family like I've had at the YMCA. I spent most of my younger life building a family, and it was the wrong kind of family to build. Over the last few years I've been coming here, and it's all about how everybody cares. That's probably why I'm here all the time, and I'm driven to be here.

"If it wasn't for the Y and that room, (Studio B, where Brett practiced for hours relearning how to walk) I don't think I would have been able to do what I've done. To run 15 miles after a year is pretty good since I could barely move when I first came here. I thought I was done for then. But I did it, all because of the Y."

From watching our membership climb back (and past!) pre-pandemic level, opening a new childcare location, and having another successful annual campaign – it seems we are always in motion here at the Y!

After years of discussion, our Board of Directors approved a second childcare location at the Itasca Resource Center building. This was not an easy decision. While we knew the immediate need for more childcare options, there were challenges that came with trying to expand off-site. Ultimately, we decided to move forward. The Y staff worked tirelessly in preparation of the September 2023 opening. A special thanks to Joni Namyst, Renae Hollom, and April Blankenship who made what should have been impossible, possible! This resulted in the opening of 6 new classrooms, with 64 NEW childcare slots. While this expansion has been accompanied by a number of new challenges, we are thrilled to be doing more to support working families in our community.

The Board voted to invest \$100,000 to renovate our family / individual locker room. This project was completed in April of 2024. These renovations helped to create more privacy and additional changing stalls – all while refreshing the floors, hardware, and lockers.

We had another incredibly successful annual campaign, raising over \$150,000 through individuals and businesses. These funds ensure no one is ever turned away from our Y programs due to an inability to pay. In addition, our annual auction raised \$63,000. This yet again highlights the confidence our donors have in our mission – and for that we THANK YOU!

Our CEO, Joni Namyst, officially had a full year in her leadership. The board is continually impressed with her poise, strength, and ability to pivot and navigate all that comes her way. Our Leadership Team changed and grew – with Development Director, Rachelle Miller joining in early 2023, and new Membership Director, Randy Kuechle joining in late 2023. Both have added so much to the Y leadership team and processes. THANK YOU to all of the incredible staff here at the Y!

Finally, while challenging, we had the opportunity to uphold our commitment to equitable practices. The Y board and leadership stands behind and is committed to being an inclusive organization that is for all. We believe that we are stronger when we are together, when our doors are open to all, and when everyone has the opportunity to learn, grow, and thrive.

I am continually in awe of the immense amount of work that goes into keeping all of our programs going. Our mission at the Y is to strengthen ourselves, families, and communities by promoting growth in spirit, mind, and body. This year was the start of some big changes that will continue to be focused specifically on our communities. This includes YOU – our youth, adults, seniors, individuals, families, who are always at the heart of our work.







